A message from the Rev'd Canon Nicki Bland

Dear Friends,

As we welcome the month of May, our thoughts turn to an important historical milestone - the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day on May 8th. This momentous day marks when Nazi Germany formally surrendered to the Allied Forces in 1945, bringing an end to World War II in Europe after six long years of conflict.

Across our nation, numerous commemorative events will honour this significant anniversary. A special National Service of Remembrance will be held at Westminster Abbey, with veterans, dignitaries, and members of the Royal Family in attendance. Following tradition, beacons will illuminate the country at 9:15 pm, symbolizing how the light of peace emerged from the darkness of war. Churches throughout the nation will participate by ringing their bells at 3 pm - the exact time when Prime Minister Churchill announced the end of the war in Europe.

VE Day represents far more than military victory. It commemorates the end of devastating conflict across Europe, honours the sacrifice of millions of service personnel and civilians, and marks the beginning of rebuilding and reconciliation. This day reminds us of the foundations of modern Europe and international cooperation, celebrating the triumph of freedom over tyranny and oppression. Even as we celebrate peace and victory, we remember that the war continued in the Pacific until August 1945, and that many families were still grieving tremendous losses even as celebrations took place.

As we reflect on this past conflict, we remain sadly aware that war continues to affect many around the world today. In this spirit, I share these prayers for peace and for those suffering in current conflicts:

Prayer for Peace

Almighty God, from whom all thoughts of truth and peace proceed, Kindle in the hearts of all people the true love of peace. Guide with your pure and peaceable wisdom Those who take counsel for the nations of the earth; That in tranquility your kingdom may go forward, Till the earth is filled with the knowledge of your love; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Those in Conflict Zones

Lord of all compassion, We pray for all who endure the cruelty of war, For those who face danger and fear each day, For children who have known nothing but conflict, For parents who protect and provide in the most difficult circumstances. Be their comfort and their strength. Sustain them in their courage, And bring them peace. Amen.

I warmly invite you to participate in our commemoration of this historic event on May 8^{th} - more information is elsewhere in this newsletter.

St Nicolas Church Restoration Group Update – May 2025

Over the last few months, restoration work at St Nicolas has been quietly continuing with a lot going on behind the scenes. We are extremely grateful to everyone who has helped to make a huge difference to the churchyard, in particular. You may well remember the huge mound of earth that was left over from numerous burials over many years? Thanks to Phil Lewis and Tony Bolton, that has now been levelled out, and Paul Baker and his team, plus our wonderful Garden Angels have used the rest to level up many of the graves which had sunk, which will make mowing much easier. Paul and his team have now seeded all these areas, and the stones are being raked off it again, so hopefully, once we get some rain, grass will begin to grow, and the churchyard will look a picture in time for the Summer Cream Teas.

We are also finally making progress with the new heating and lighting plans, having received a massive setback when the Diocese changed its lighting policies, just as we were finalising our original plans. It was extremely annoying at the time but may well have done us a favour in the long term as, after months of searching, our electrician has found a new system which could prove to be more cost-effective in the long run. We are getting the last details pulled together and very much hope to be in a position to apply for a faculty shortly which will then enable us to get on with some serious fundraising. In the meantime, please do come and join us on Thursday 8th May for our next fund-raising initiative – VE Day Celebrations and an Official Beacon Lighting at Wood Farm. Tickets are strictly limited, but there are still a few left.

Finally, I am delighted to say that the bench that was so generously donated by The Neighbourhood Café has recently been delivered, and we hope to have it sited in the churchyard in the next couple of weeks. Thank you very much to everyone who donated so generously towards its purchase. It is just what is needed on the north side of the church as there is nowhere for anyone to sit at present.
